

Womens Institute founder Adelaide Hunter Hoodless

Adelaide Hunter Hoodless' home is not in St George, as reported in the annual meeting in Fergus Aug 1994. The home is on the Blue Lake Rd., a few miles from Hwy 24 and across 24 from where Hwy 5 goes on to St. George. It is maintained by the Women's Institute, and is quite a tourist attraction during the summer months and on special occasions. Adelaide Hunter Hoodless had a little girl who died after drinking contaminated milk, and decided to inform the public of that danger. She was attending a farmers meeting at Stoney Creek and met Erland Lee, who persuaded her to form a meeting of country women. She did so, and on Feb 17th, 1897 the 1st meeting of the Women's Institute was held in the Squire's Hall, Stoney Creek. One hundred and one ladies attended and the Womens Institute has been active Canada-wide ever since I have been a member of the Oakhill W.I. for

many years. The home on the Blue Lake Rd was originally the home of the Hunter family. There are many Hunters in this area, with fifty-four Hunters in the Brantford phone book, so "we" are quite prevalent.
